








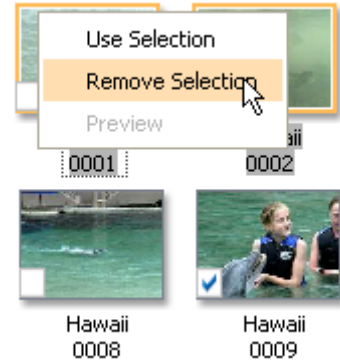
Producing Stunning Video in Minutes With CineMagic

Roxio Easy Media Creator 10

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| <p>This tutorial will demonstrate how to quickly and easily produce stunning video using CineMagic, an Easy Media Creator 10 Task Assistant.</p> | |
| <p>1. Run Easy Media Creator 10 Suite, and click Video in the Project Pane.</p> |  |
| <p>2. Then click CineMagic.</p> <p>This opens Roxio CineMagic.</p> |  |
| <p>3. Click Add Video/Photos.</p> <p>CineMagic opens the Add Video/Photo dialog. Note that you can use CineMagic with digital photos and videos, but this tutorial will use a video file.</p> |  |
| <p>4. Add videos by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Clicking any individual video and then selecting Add Video/Photo. • Add contiguous videos by clicking the first video, holding down the Shift key and clicking the last video; then select Add Video/Photo. • Add random photos by holding down the Ctrl key and clicking all desired videos and then Add Video/Photo. |  |
| <p>5. If desired, click Select Scenes to open CineMagic's Video Scenes Selector dialog where you can choose which scenes to include in the video and which to cut.</p> <p>Note that you can let CineMagic choose all scenes by skipping step 6 and jumping right to Step 7.</p> |  |
| <p>6. In the Video Scene Selector dialog, you can:</p> | |

- Remove any scene or scene by right clicking them and choosing **Remove Selection**.
- Force CineMagic to include any scene by clicking the checkbox in the lower left corner (like Hawaii 0009).
- Let CineMagic decide whether to include a scene by leaving the checkbox in the lower left corner unchecked (like Hawaii 0008).

After making your scene selections, click **OK** to close the dialog.

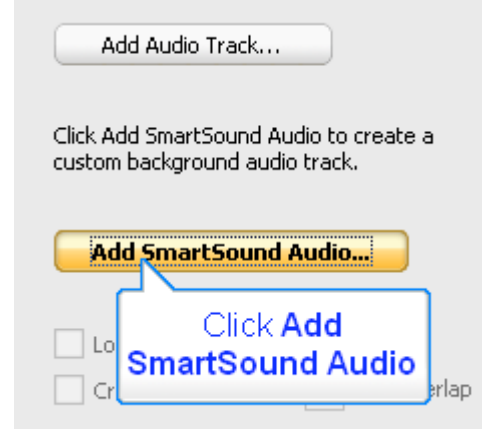


7. To add music to your project, click **Add Background Audio**.



8. Click **Add Audio Track** to choose any audio file that you have on disk, or you can create new background music using SmartSound. Click **Add SmartSound Audio** to explore that option.

CineMagic opens the SmartSound Audio dialog. Here, you'll choose your background music and customize its duration.



9. Here's the process.

- First, select a **Style/Library**, which are labeled in the common genres you can see below.
- Then, select a **Title**, which are different songs within that genre.
- Finally, choose a **Variation**, which are different variations of that song.





e. After selecting your music, enter the desired **Duration** into the duration fields. As you can see on the right, the three counters are for hours, minutes and seconds.

Then Click **OK** to close the SmartSound Audio dialog, and Click **OK** to close the Background Audio dialog.

10. On the bottom right of CineMagic, click **Next** to move to page 2.

In the Customize your slideshow section, you can choose a Style.</p> <p>This controls the look and pace of the introduction, transitions and other effects. | <p>12. Further down, click Fit to Audio, if desired. This will fit the duration of the video to the selected music.</p> |  <p>Set the production duration:</p> <p>01 : 40 mm:ss</p> <p><input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Fit to Audio</p> <p>Click Fit to Audio (if desired)</p> |
| <p>13. Then, type a Main Title if desired. This will appear at the start of your video.</p> |  <p><input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Fit to Audio</p> <p>Arrange video/p</p> <p><input checked="" type="radio"/> Sequential</p> <p><input type="radio"/> Random order</p> <p>Main Title: My Summer Vacation</p> <p>Sub-title:</p> |
| <p>14. To preview your video, click Preview in the bottom left corner of CineMagic.</p> |  <p>Click Preview</p> <p>Preview</p> |
| <p>15. After previewing the video, you can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Preview another Style by clicking Close, choosing another Style and clicking Preview again. To accept the style, click Close and move to step 16. | |

16. To save and produce your video, click **Next** to open the output dialog.



17. In the Output dialog, you can:

- **Save this Project**, which you probably should before taking any further steps.
- **Burn to Disc**, which opens MyDVD Express.
- **Create File**, to create a video file you can watch on your computer or share with others.
- **Edit in VideoWave**. VideoWave is Easy Media Creator's full-featured video editor, which offers additional creative options.
